VOLUNTEER DEVELOPMENT – COACHES-POLICY 3

The North Mandurah Junior Football Club (NMJFC) recognizes that all parents should have the opportunity to be actively involved in their children's sport. The NMJFC encourages parents to develop their skills in a variety of roles.

The NMJFC believes it is important for the development of players and for increasing the depth and strength of the club that coaches should be rotated at least every two years in the under 9 to 13's age groups.

The NMJFC will provide opportunities for all parents to coach by:

- Offering nominations for coaching positions each year in all age groups
- Placing a two year maximum term on head coaching positions in the 9 to 13 competition (subject to parent interest and nomination)
- Allocating coaching positions based upon experience and criteria as set out in the Coach Allocation Procedure for 14 – 16's.

The NMJFC will develop the skills of coaches by:

- Providing free Level 1 coaching and subsidized level 2
- Providing skills workshops during the season
- Providing opportunities for coaches to network and share experiences and ideas

The NMJFC will expect their coaches to:

- Know the rules of AFL and the current Peel District Junior Competition by-laws
- Abide by the rules and by-laws
- To follow the NMJFC Code of Conduct
- Be positive role models for players, other volunteers, and to represent the Club in a positive manner at all times

Policy Review

To ensure this policy continues to be relevant for club operation and that it reflects community expectations, the policy will be reviewed annually.
